## 21 + 3 BONUS JACKPOT SYSTEM

The rules for the Blackjack 21+3 Bonus Jackpot system at this casino (as set out below) are our commitment to players in ensuring that the gambling we offer is 'Fair and Open' in accordance with the licensing objectives of the Gambling Act 2005. In the event of a dispute resulting from any ambiguity in the rules, the decision shall always be in the player's favour until such time as that ambiguity has been resolved

### 21 + 3 BONUS JACKPOT WAGER

- To make this wager a player must also make a standard blackjack wager.
- This wager is that the player's first two cards combined with the Dealer's first card forms a Three Card Poker hand of a Straight or better.
- If a player makes this wager and their first two cards combined with the Dealer's first card does not form a Three Card Poker hand of a Straight or better, then the wager will be lost to the House. If the player's first two cards combined with the Dealer's first card forms a Three Card Poker hand of a Straight or better, they will be paid at the amounts below for each stake:

HAND	£1 STAKE	£5 STAKE	£10 STAKE
3 of a kind suited – Aces, Kings or Queens	100% of Jackpot	100% of Jackpot	100% of Jackpot
3 of a kind suited – Other	£125	£625	£1250
Straight Flush	£25	£125	£250
Three of a kind - Off suit	£20	£100	£200
Straight	£6	£30	£60
Flush	£2	£10	£20

- If the player's hand does not hit one of the above rankings, the progressive wager will lose.
- Only the highest hand formed from each player's ranking hand with the Dealer's first card will be paid out.
- If there are two or more winning 'Jackpot' hand of the same category on the same table during the same round, then the appropriate jackpot amount will be shared equally amongst those winning players
- Hand rankings shall not be considered in such circumstances.
- In the event of a misdeal all wagers are void.

### A PLAYERS GUIDE TO THE HOUSE EDGE

The house Edge is a measure of how much the house expects to win expressed as a percentage of the player's wager. For example, in a wager with the house edge of 5% the player will lose £5 for every £100 wagered. House edge varies by region, casino and game. In some games, player betting or skills decisions can affect the edge, but it is important to keep in mind that the house always has some advantage against the typical player.
